4-DAY ITINERARY, DEPARTING 5 OCTOBER 2023

5 October London / Amsterdam

Suggested flight (not included in the cost of the tour) British Airways BA 434 departing London Heathrow at 11.45 hrs arriving Amsterdam Schiphol at 14.05 hrs. Lunch under own arrangements.

Transfer to the luxury Pulitzer Hotel conveniently situated along the canal belt and where three nights are spent. This afternoon embark on a private vintage barge for a cruise of the Amsterdam waterways. Enjoy an introduction to this fascinating city while navigating the canals, which give an unrivalled view of the beautiful 17th century architecture of Amsterdam. Dinner at the hotel.

6 October Amsterdam

This morning depart by private transfer to visit the Rijksmuseum. This museum has an incomparable collection of Dutch paintings, with major works by all the important painters of the Dutch school and Rembrandt's most celebrated painting The Night Watch.

Lunch at a local restaurant.
Afternoon visit to Rembrandt's

House. The ten-room house is furnished with 17th-century objects and furniture that match the descriptions in the artist's 1656 petition for bankruptcy, recreating the old house and the way it looked when the artist lived and worked there. Two hundred and fifty of his etchings and drawings hang on the walls including self-portraits and landscapes. Return to the hotel where the remainder of the afternoon is at leisure. Dinner under own arrangements.

7 October Amsterdam, The Hague & Delft

Depart by private transfer for The Hague to visit the Mauritshuis, a 17th century classical palace in the Italian style, which contains a magnificent collection of Dutch paintings including works by Rembrandt and Vermeer as well as Rubens, Teniers, Jordaens and van Brueghel. Walking tour of the historic city of The Hague which, although it boasts the national seat of Government, seems more a grand village than a capital city. Visit to the Mesdag Panorama

which has perhaps the best surviving of the illusionistic 19th century all-round views. Drive to Delft.

Lunch under own arrangements in Delft followed by a walking tour through the charming city centre. In the picturesque market square visit the Nieuwe Kerk with its imposing mausoleum of William of Orange (the Silent), also see the Oude Kerk which dates from the 13th century. Return to Amsterdam and dinner at a local restaurant a short walk from the hotel.

8 October Amsterdam / London

Lecture by Douglas at the hotel on the life and work of Van Gogh. Depart by private transfer for the Van Gogh Museum which houses the largest collection of paintings by Vincent van Gogh in the world.

Free time and lunch under own arrangements at the museum cafe Transfer to Amsterdam Schiphol Airport. Suggested flight (not included) British Airways BA 439 departing Amsterdam at 16.10 hrs arriving London Heathrow at 16.30 hrs.
